Rate adjustment effective for May 2017 billing

THE HOLMES-WAYNE ELECTRIC Board of Trustees approved a rate adjustment that will take effect with the May 2017 member billings. This was approved during the Nov. 22, 2016, board meeting. The adjustment will impact the average residence by 21 cents a day.

The approved rate adjustment includes changes to the retail kWh rates, outdoor lighting rates, and monthly consumer charge, which is the monthly service fee that generates revenue needed to provide electric service to each meter in our 2,200-mile distribution system.

One of the primary responsibilities of the board of trustees is to ensure that the cooperative remains fiscally strong and is able to meet the loan covenants required by the USDA and other financing organizations, as well as meet the cooperative's capital needs. To assist with the analysis of financial position, the board contracted GDS & Associates, Inc., a rate-consulting firm headquartered in Marietta, Georgia. They provided a study of our cost of service, projected revenues, and power costs for 2017. Based on the firm's recommendation and advice from senior management, the board voted to implement the rate adjustment detailed on page 20.

Electric generation, transmission, and environmental regulatory costs are major factors that have contributed to the need for an adjustment in rates. Over the last several years, the Power Cost Adjustment (PCA) has been a component of your bill. The PCA covers the increase in power generation and transmission we were experiencing when current rates were not covering the total generation and transmission cost.

Based on feedback from the membership, we continue to improve reliability for members through maintaining and improving our distribution infrastructure (electric poles, wires, etc.). With construction and replacement of our infrastructure, we have experienced increases in the cost of the materials and equipment.

Additionally, as with most industries, we have realized increases in general operating expenses. However, Holmes-Wayne Electric has not

adjusted rates for the past five years, which is a testament to our culture of innovativeness, efficiency, and technological advancement.

HWEC continues to be committed as sound stewards of your investment in your electric cooperative. As a not-for-profit, member-owned cooperative, any revenue collected in excess of operating expenses is returned to you — our members — in the form of capital credits.

As board chairman and as the President/CEO of HWEC, we understand our responsibility to set equitable rates for our members, while maintaining the financial stability of the cooperative. We feel that we are accomplishing that delicate balance.

As always, we are here to serve you. Through this publication, our Facebook page, billing notes, and our website, we provide energy efficiency tips to reduce your electric consumption. ^{*} PCA (Power Cost Adjustment) is the additional charge as a result of the actual power (generation and transmission) cost being more than the power cost that is currently built into our rates.

^{**} The consumer charge is a monthly minimum cost incurred for each meter and not based on kWh consumption. This charge is each member/owner's proportionate share (per meter) of infrastructure investment in substations and distribution equipment.
