o you want to save money and electricity but have limited time, money, and patience? Much of that money, however, is wasted through leaky windows or ducts, old appliances, or inefficient heating and cooling systems.

Where to start

Let Holmes-Wayne Electric Doors and windows may not close tightly, and ductwork can spring leaks, wasting cooled and heated air. By placing weather stripping and caulk around windows and doors, you can keep cool air inside during warm home energy audit! months and prevent chilly air from penetrating the indoors during colder months. Sealing gaps around piping, dryer vents, fans, and outlets also helps to seal the envelope and creates greater efficiency. Apply weather stripping around overlooked spaces

like your attic hatch or pull-down stairs.

Replacing incandescent bulbs with LED bulbs can make a big difference in home efficiency and is one of the fastest ways to cut your energy bill. Known for their longevity and efficiency, LED bulbs have an estimated operational life span of typically 10,000 to 20,000 hours compared to 1,000 hours of a typical incandescent bulb. According to the Department of Energy (DOE), by replacing your

home's five most frequently used light fixtures or bulbs with models that have earned the ENERGY STAR®-rating, you can save \$75 each year!

Wrapping up savings

Installing a blanket around your water heater could reduce standby heat losses by 25 to 45 percent.

Checking, changing, or cleaning your filter extends the life of your HVAC system and saves you money. Otherwise, dust and dirt trapped in a system's air filter leads to several problems, including:

reduced air flow in the home and up to 15 percent higher operating costs; lowered system efficiency; and costly duct cleaning or replacement.

TREE TRIMMING

CLEARING RIGHT-OF-WAY FOR RELIABILITY


There are many ways that Holmes-Wayne Electric Cooperative provides you with safe, reliable electric service. One of the most common — and crucial — ways is referred to as right-ofway clearing, or vegetation management.

A right-of-way (ROW) refers to a strip of land underneath or around power lines that your electric cooperative has the right and responsibility to maintain and clear. Trees must grow at a distance far enough from wires where they will not cause harm to people or disruption to electrical service. Specifications vary, but a general guideline of maintaining a safe ROW is 15 feet of clearance on either side of the primary lines.

Clearing the ROW is critical to keeping our members' lights on. ROW clearing also keeps your family safe by ensuring that tree branches do not become energized because of close contact with a downed power line. Be mindful when around trees close to power lines, and make sure your kids know that climbing trees near lines is extremely dangerous.

ROW clearing is critical to ensuring that we provide members with affordable electricity. Staying ahead of the game keeps us from having to restore power outages caused by fallen trees.

Remember to contact Holmes-Wayne Electric if you decide to trim or remove trees near any power service or line. And never trim a tree in the ROW zone on your own.
